Sometimes the last words we hear from someone are the most touching and the most important. Sometimes they are often the most treasured and remembered words. The Farewell Discourse of John 14-17 is such a passage is scripture. It was delivered immediately following the Last Supper and just before his arrest in the Garden.

There are some important parts to it: Jesus reveals he is going away to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will come to help and guide. The unity of Jesus with his Father and Jesus with his disciples is emphasized. The New Commandment is given: "love one another as I have loved you." There is the well-known allegory of "The Vine". The reality of the world hating Jesus and the disciples is revealed. Finally, Jesus prays the longest prayer in the gospels. Jesus prays for his disciples and he prays for those who will follow them (us!). The gift and ministry of the Holy Spirit is in several places. Love within the fellowship is crucial.

If you read this passage you will hear familiar words that are often used in funerals, stories used in Sunday School, little snippets, sometimes quoted, but not often read as a unified whole.


On Maundy Thursday, we will read these dramatic words as a whole. We will include chapter 13, as it is the preparation to the farewell. The discourse starts after Judas departs to betray Jesus, the feet of the disciples are then washed by Jesus, which is a kind of a cleansing of the fellowship.

The word "Maundy" comes from the ritual of the washing of the feet. Maundy Thursday is also Sheer Thursday in some Christian circles, as it was a tradition to sheer the beard on that day. The conclusion of the Maundy Thursday observance kicks off the Triduum observance: the three high and holy days of Christendom: Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter.

The Sunday sermons during Lent will be occupied with the Farewell Discourse. These are indeed, transformative words, meant for the disciples of Jesus during a critical time. Don't you think you should be
